#### Attendance

I have sent out a copy of the attendance policy with the newsletter this week. The policy is also available on our website. Attendance at our school is generally very good and our overall attendance figure at the end of last year was 97.7%. We begin to get concerned about a child's attendance if it drops to 95% and this is when we may involve our Educational Welfare Officer to try and support a family in order to improve attendance. Inevitably children get ill from time to time, and have to be kept off school, but it is when absence becomes more regular, or has a pattern, that we become concerned.

Routine appointments for the GP, dentist or other medical professionals need to be made outside of school hours. We recognise that hospital appointments are less flexible so these are allowed during the day. Any planned absence from school must be requested using the 'Request for Absence' form available in the office, rather than via email to the office or to me. We will need to see proof of medical appointments. Other absence requests will need to be discussed with me once the form is submitted and will only be authorised in exceptional and unavoidable circumstances.

Congratulations to all our new Head Boy, Johnny Gardner, and Head Girl, Elizabeth Anghenica, and to all our other Year 6 prefects, our school councillors and the new pupil chaplains. We look forward to working with them, and hearing their ideas, this coming year.
