Dear Parents

We watched a lovely assembly prepared and presented by Year 6 this week. They focussed on the concept of 'Growth Mindsets'. They reminded us that we must move away from having a fixed mindset ie, instead of thinking 'I can't do it', trying to think 'I will give it another go'. Instead of saying 'I've made a mistake so I'm going to give up' we should try and think 'I will learn better if I make mistakes'.

Through acting out stories they showed what can happen if we are able to persevere and keep trying, if we can deal with disappointment and move on. Their portrayal of the parable of the Unforgiving Servant reminded us that we must try to forgive others and to support those who make mistakes.

These are attitudes that we try to embrace within school, allowing the children to develop growth mindsets which will enable them to succeed in school and in life.

Thank you to Mr Dobson and Ms Todd for the lovely assembly, and to all the staff who have worked so hard to present class assemblies this term.
