During the annual review of our service with the P2B area manager last week, I was able to feedback that P2B now feels truly embedded within our school and is very well used by children, staff and parents.

It does seem timely though to offer a few reminders about the service:

- Tania's role focusses on the well-being of the children. This often involves meeting with parents (some of whom initiate the meetings) but the focus is always on the children. Should a parent require support with their own needs, we can sign-post them to other services, or a referral to our parent therapist Natalie may be appropriate
- Tania only works in our school for a day and a half per week (Monday mornings and Thursdays). Consequently, she is not always able to offer immediate meetings for parents and children. She does her best to triage requests and to hold meetings as quickly as she can, depending on need.

In order to try and improve the efficiency of parent meetings we are looking at alternative ways of booking meetings which will require some prior information beforehand so that Tania can better judge the urgency, and have time to prepare advice based on the expected content of the meeting. We will get back to you with further details about this in the new year.
