Dear Parents

It has been wonderful to have our pupils and staff back in school. The children all seem happy to have returned, to have structure and purpose to their day and, of course, to socialise with their friends. We have spent some time assessing where they are, so that we can look at how best to continue their learning. Our focus is not so much on 'catching up' with national benchmarks, but more about looking at individual gaps and making sure that there are firm foundations in the children's learning. It's important that we don't rush, and that we pace the teaching correctly so that the learning is consolidated and built on.

One of our main focuses now is getting the children back into 'school mode'. We have spent the last couple of weeks allowing them to reconnect with their friends, and find their feet again at school. However, we now feel it is time for them to be reminded of the high expectations that we have here at St Anselm's. In assembly this morning, Mrs Patterson spent some time going through the expectations in school in terms of behaviour, application and attitude. This starts with them coming to school dressed smartly, in their correct uniform which needs to be worn properly. We expect them to have school shoes on, hair tied back if shoulder length or longer, ties tied right up, and there should be no additional accessories. We want them to remember how to be respectful in school and how to apply themselves to their work in class.

Another important reminder is our school focus on Growth Mindset. We want the children to remember that it's ok to make a mistake and in fact, the best learning comes from mistakes and perseverance. When we are stuck in the 'learning pit', it's the journey out of the pit that instils good learning habits, and deeper understanding.
