Dear Parents

We are determined to try and have our Theme Week this term and have pencilled it in for the week beginning 12th July. For those of you who were new to the school this year or last year, Theme week is a long-standing St Anselm's tradition which normally takes place at the end of the spring term. We base the week on a theme and all the learning that week focuses on this theme. We generally have a range of different types of activities and the week culminates in a Theme Week assembly which includes a 'Big Dance'. We may have to make some adjustments this year and we probably won't be able to work across classes like we usually do, but we will have a great week none-the-less. Theme Week assembly is scheduled for the afternoon of 20th July. It is too early yet to know whether parents will be able to attend but we will certainly go ahead with the children all being well.

The theme will be 'Planet Hope' which is the theme we had planned for our aborted Theme Week in March 2020. It is a topical subject, which will focus on the preservation of our environment. We have noticed a certain anxiety amongst the children about the future of our planet as they are exposed to lots of mixed messages from the media. As a result we feel that we have a

responsibility to give the children a clear, age-appropriate message about the concerns for our environment but, more importantly, we want to focus on the word 'hope'. We feel it is key that the children get a positive message about what we can do now in order to preserve our planet, and provide hope and sustainability for the future. This theme has a strong link with the Pope's Encyclical, Laudato Si. You will receive more information about Theme Week nearer the time.





We are very pleased with our new canopy which has been built in the reception outdoor area. This will allow the children to access their outdoor learning all year round and in all weathers.
