## **COVID** restrictions

The local authority has asked its schools to continue to follow Step 3 guidance until pupils return to school in September. This means that all our current plans and systems will stay in place until the end of term. Hopefully, by continuing to be careful and vigilant, we can minimise the risk of someone falling ill, or a bubble having to close and families having to start the summer holiday in isolation. The numbers of COVID cases in Wandsworth continues to rise and a large number of bubbles are closed in local schools.

Headteachers have also been asked to continue to undertake their contact tracing responsibility until 16th August and therefore, if you child tests positive after the end of term, you must inform the school (head@stanselms.wandworth.sch.uk) so that the rest of the class can be informed. After 16th August, no child under 18 will be required to isolate if identified as a close contact of a positive case by NHS Test and Trace.

We hope that, by September, we will be able to implement the Step 4 Guidance for Schools which dictates far less restrictions. Time will tell.
