This morning, I took our Pupil Chaplains up to St. George's Cathedral, Southwark for the Beginning of the Year Mass. It was a lovely occasion, with representation from the majority of both primary and secondary schools in the Archdiocese of Southwark. The Mass was celebrated by The Most Rev. John Wilson, Archbishop of Southwark, who spoke to the children about the importance of using the words from the bible to help us to live our lives in the way Jesus wants us to.
