Dear Parents

This year, the nine Catholic primary schools in Wandsworth are increasingly working together in order to support teachers and share good practice. All the teachers are spending time with year group colleagues in other schools and are sharing ideas about how to improve and assess writing. Last week I had an interesting meeting with the other seven Headteachers where we discussed our School Development Plans. It became clear that all nine schools are focussing on very similar areas as we continue to try and implement the new National Curriculum, and the new requirements for assessment. We feel very blessed that we have such hard working and dedicated staff who have had to adapt to a number of new government initiatives in a very short space of time, creating an increased workload at all levels. Whilst the quantity of work that children have to cover in a year has increased, as well as the expectations, we continue to try and make sure that our curriculum is interesting, fun and creative, as well as striving to ensure that the children achieve their best.

Our main school development priorities for this year are:

- 1. To continue to improve standards. To ensure that differentiation is well planned to meet the needs of all groups.
- 2. To develop standards in writing at expected levels and increase the number of children achieving 'greater depth'. To narrow the gap between boys' and girls' writing.
- 3. To develop provision in EYFS and improve resources.
- 4. To further establish the senior and middle leadership roles in order to raise standards
- 5. To continue to develop and embed assessment following the introduction of the new assessment procedures.
- 6. To review and develop governance

Theme week

Theme week this year will focus on Shakespeare. Unfortunately the dates in the calendar were published incorrectly and the actual date of theme week is the week of 27th March. There will be an assembly and open afternoon celebrating the children's work, at 2pm on Wednesday 5 April. We are already very enthused about what we can achieve and are working hard to plan a fun and productive week. On 27th March, in the afternoon, we will be having a music concert in school, in order to celebrate the children's musical talents. The choir will perform, as well as the children in Years 3 and 4 on their recorders. There will also be a chance for some children who play instruments at home to perform a piece. The children in Y4 and Y5 have already had a saxophone concert this year. We are also delighted that Y4 have been chosen to play their saxophones with 250 other children in the Royal Festival Hall in June.

The choir will also be singing at The Catholic Schools Choir Festival on March 24th at Sacred Heart Church in Battersea, at 2pm.
